“I Will Do Your Will”

Psalm 40:1-17

Ladies some time ago we were on a fact-finding journey. Our writer, tour guide, and Rabbi Rose, prepared a trip for us. We visited the Temple Institute. Here we learned about the Tabernacle and its furnishings. We also learned that each aspect of this earthly Tabernacle was a copy and a shadow of the real and the better things to come. Last week we traveled to a small church where we took part in communion. While there, Rabbi Rose explained the importance of keeping Communion from becoming mundane or in other word, uneventful!

We picked up our study in the final verses of Hebrews 9:23-28. We gained an understanding from our writer that as believers, we are not obligated to keep The Law. The old covenant was merely a shadow of the New Covenant. Our writer conveyed to us that Jesus Christ fulfilled the Law as we look at His finished work at Calvary. Jesus Christ's ministry required a once-for-all, a sacrifice sufficient to bear the sins for many.

The writer presents three key points concerning Christ's appearance;

- Appearing in the presence of God for us;
- Appearing to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself.
- Appearing a second time, apart from sin, for salvation.

Along that same line, he listed five reasons the New Covenant Sanctuary was superior.

- It is heavenly (v. 11), and
- its ministry is effective in dealing with sin (vv. 12-15).
- Its ministry also rests on a more costly sacrifice (vv. 16-23),
- represents fulfillment (v. 24),
- and it is final and complete (vv. 25-28).
